It is said that behind every great band lies an even greater drummer, and in the world of drummers, there are few who can top the LAPD Band's Jack LeCompte. Raised in Philadelphia, Jack began formal drum lessons at age 13. He went on to complete his studies at the Philadelphia School of the Arts. He attributes his love and knowledge of the drums to his teacher and mentor, Carl Motolla, a renowned Philly musician. In 1980, Jack made his way to Los Angeles, and has since become known as an exceptionally versatile drummer, percussionist and overall outstanding musician.

Jack has recorded and performed with a multitude of renowned artists, such as Anita O'Day, Les Brown Big Band, Stevie Wonder, Liza Minnelli, Bette Midler, Gladys Knight and the Pips, and Natalie Cole. He has also been featured in movies and on TV, including "Bird," "The Charlie Parker Story" and "The Tonight Show with Jay Leno." In 2008, Jack recorded at the famed EGREM Studios in Havana, Cuba, with legendary bass player Orlando "Cachaíto" Lopez, the double bass player of international fame known as "the heartbeat of the Buena Vista Social Club.'

Jack is also passionate about teaching, and along with 2000 Grammy nominee Bobby Rodriguez and the Jazz Adventure, has brought jazz education and history to Los Angeles County schools. Performing more than 100 concerts per year for over 15 years, reaching students from K-12, Jack presently conducts after-school percussion classes for LACER (Los Angeles Center for Educational Research) within the L.A. Unified School District. He is also involved with the Children's Music Workshop and its UCLA-sponsored Honors Orchestra. Additionally, Jack serves as in-class orchestral percussion coach for the Irving Middle School Concert Band, LAUSD. Jack is educationally endorsed by Paiste, Yamaha, Vic Firth and Remo.

For the past five years, Jack has also played with the Desert Symphony Orchestra Ovation Series at the McCallum Theatre in Palm Desert, Calif.

After years of playing with well-known artists, Jack teamed up with fellow Philadelphia musicians Lou Shoch (bass) and Larry DiTommaso (piano) to record his first solo album, "Blue Collar." Jack is currently focusing on his second solo album.
